Acute toxicity

Assessment of acute toxicity:

Virtually non-toxic after single ingestion. Virtually non-toxic after a single skin contact. Virtually non-toxic by inhalation.

Mutagenicity tests revealed no genotoxic potential. The product has not been tested. The statement has been derived from the properties of the individual components.

Assessment of carcinogenicity:

The product has not been tested. The statement has been derived from the properties of the individual components.

Information on: Pendimethalin Assessment of carcinogenicity:

In long-term studies in rats the substance induced thyroid tumours. The effect is caused by an animal specific mechanism that has no human counterpart. In long-term studies in mice in which the substance was given by feed, a carcinogenic effect was not observed.

Reproductive toxicity

Assessment of reproduction toxicity:

The results of animal studies gave no indication of a fertility impairing effect. The product has not been tested. The statement has been derived from the properties of the individual components.

Developmental toxicity

Assessment of teratogenicity:

The product has not been tested. The statement has been derived from the properties of the individual components.

Information on: Pendimethalin Assessment of teratogenicity:

Indications of possible developmental toxicity / teratogenicity were seen in animal studies.
